

Which companies are operating in Senegal's oil and gas sectors?

The following are the main companies operating in Senegal's oil and gas sectors: BP (BP.L) and U.S.-listed Kosmo Energy (KOS.N) are leading the development of Greater Tortue Ahmeyim (GTA), Senegal's first liquefied natural gas (LNG) project.

Which companies are re-negotiating oil and gas contracts in Senegal?

The announcement followed a campaign promise to re-negotiate the terms of oil, gas and mineral contracts with foreign operators in the country, which is set to begin producing oil and gas this year. The following are the main companies operating in Senegal's oil and gas sectors: BP

Does total own oil & gas in Senegal?

TOTAL The French energy major signed an agreement in 2017 to explore for oil and gas off Senegal's Atlantic coast. Under the deal, Total is exploring in the deepwater Rufisque and Ultra Deep Offshore blocks where it is the operator and holds 90% and 70% stakes respectively.

Who produces energy in Senegal?

Energy is produced by private operators and sold to the Senelec energy corporation. According to a 2020 report by the International Energy Agency, Senegal had nearly 70% of the country connected to the national grid. Current government strategies for electrification include investments in off-grid solar and connection to the grid.

Who owns Senegal's power?

Senelec owns 15%, while West African Energy controls the remaining 85%. The project, located near Dakar, will use indigenous gas, potentially reducing Senegal's power rates. Turbines are supplied by General Electric, while engineering and construction are handled by Calik Enerji. Sendou - 125 MW

Does Senegal have energy independence?

The facility provides energy independence, decreasing import prices with Senegal's projected oil and gas output. The EUR154 million project was finished on time in February 2023 and improved Senegal's electricity generation by 8%.

BP is the project's operator, with a 56% stake. Kosmos Energy holds a 27% stake. Senegal, through its national oil company Petrosen, holds 10%, and Mauritania, through its SMHPM oil...

Kosmos entered Senegal in 2014 when it acquired its original acreage position which was adjacent to, and on trend with, our blocks in Mauritania. Over several years, Kosmos drilled three wells offshore Senegal (Guembeul-1, Teranga-1, and Yakaar-1) with each discovering significant natural gas resources.

As of April 2020, the energy sector in Senegal has an installed capacity of 1431 megawatts (MW). [1] Energy is produced by private operators and sold to the Senelec energy corporation.
