Solar power potential The solar potential of North Macedonia is clearly the most prominent clean energy resource in the country.

Is North Macedonia reliant on fossil fuels?

According to the national and international statistics, such as those run by the World Data and the International Energy Agency, North Macedonia remains reliant on fossil fuels<sup>28</sup>. Majority of its total energy mix, both on supply and demand side, still falls under the category of fossil fuels (Figure 2), mostly due to the usage of coal and oil.

What is North Macedonia's energy mix?

In addition, North Macedonia's energy mix includes a significant percentage of hydropower, having mountainous geography with powerful streams of rivers running through the country. For the time being, the hydropower capacity is partially used.
