

Does Ireland have a green economy?

Ireland's energy transition has been making great strides. The government has led the way in setting ambitious targets, creating favourable regulatory and support structures and creating markets for the green economy. As a result, renewable capacity has greatly expanded since 2005.

How much funding will the Connemara Greenway receive in 2022?

She added: "As a Minister based in the West of Ireland, I am also very pleased to see the Connemara Greenway receive a strong funding allocation of over EUR3 million in 2022. This funding includes the routes between Clifden to Recess (EUR1.9 million), Galway to Moycullen (EUR600k) and Derrygimlagh-Clifden-Kylemore Abbey (EUR550k).

What is Ireland's energy and Climate Plan 2023?

Ireland's National Energy and Climate Plan (NECP 2021-2030) includes a planned RES-E of 70% in 2030, while Ireland's Climate Action Plan 2023 (CAP 23) includes a target to increase the share of electricity generated from renewable sources up to 80% by 2030. The Government set an ambitious national target for RES-E of 40% for 2020.

Why are Irish Greenways so important?

The building of the various greenways has also led to closer ties formed between the local Irish communities and their European counterparts. Several of Ireland's greenways make up a part of EuroVelo 1, the Atlantic Coast Route.

How will the 2024 energy year impact Ireland?

This could have several implications for the 2024 energy year in Ireland. Opportunities for renewables growth will need to be consolidated with issues like mandates for energy efficiency and accommodating for large energy users. We need to ensure that short-term challenges do not restrict opportunities for long-term growth.

How did the Great Western Greenway influence Ireland?

The success of the Great Western Greenway inspired the Great Eastern Greenway along Carlingford Lough's southern shore, which led in turn to the Old Rail Trail Greenway from Mullingar to Athlone, Waterford's Greenway as well as the recently opened Royal Canal Greenway through Kildare to Longford which is soon to be connected to Dublin.

Energy Co-Operatives Ireland are currently working with communities in Galway, Claremorris, Tralee and Valentia Island to develop applications for large off-shore wind projects to produce hydrogen.
