Fortis Energy has announced the acquisition of a significant 180 MW (AC) solar project with an integrated Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) in Sremska Mitrovica, Serbia. This solar power plant, which will also feature a substantial energy storage system, is set to become one of the largest of its kind in Southeast Europe.

Fortis Energy, an Istanbul-based subsidiary of UCK Holding, has expanded its portfolio by acquiring a 180 MW (AC) solar project with a battery energy storage system (BESS) in Sremska Mitrovica, Serbia. This project will feature a 36 MW/h BESS and is expected to become one of the largest solar power plants and energy storage systems in Southeast ...

The detailed regulation plan for the solar power plant with battery storage near the village of Calma, north of Sremska Mitrovica, is now in an early public consultation phase. The investor is RP Global Solarne Elektrane, one of the Austrian company's three legal entities founded in Serbia.

The company plans to begin construction at the project, in Sremska Mitrovica, west of Belgrade, in 2025. The solar PV will total 180MW while the BESS facility will have a capacity of 36MWh, making the project one of the largest solar-plus-storage projects in south-east Europe, according to Fortis.

The solar farm will be located in the city of Sremska Mitrovica and construction works at the site are scheduled to begin in 2025, the company noted in a press statement. "This strategic investment strengthens Fortis"s commitment to paving the path of the energy transition," the Turkish company said.

Austrian renewables developer RP Global plans to build a 100 MW hybrid solar facility in the northern Serbian town of Sremska Mitrovica, which could include over 10 MW of battery storage capacity.

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
