The project consists of 1.2 million solar panels arranged over 6 km² of land, with a production capacity of 300MW.

How much solar power will Saudi Arabia have by 2032?

The Saudi agency in charge of developing the nation's renewable energy sector, KA-CARE, announced in May 2012 that the nation would install 41 gigawatts (GW) of solar capacity by 2032. It was projected to be composed of 25 GW of solar thermal, and 16 GW of photovoltaics.

Between 2015 and 2023, renewable power capacity in Saudi Arabia surged at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 82.4%, from 0.02GW to 3GW. Solar PV dominated the renewable power capacity landscape in 2023, accounting for 82.6%, followed by onshore wind at nearly 14.1%, and solar thermal at 3.1%.

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Sudair Solar PV Project has a planned capacity of 1,500 MW in Riyadh. Al-Masa'a IPP Solar Power Plant will generate 1,000 MW in Hail, while Ar Rass Solar PV Park is expected to have a capacity of 700 MW in Al-Qassim.
