

Does Sao Tome and Principe have a right to education?

The Human Rights Measurement Initiative (HRMI) finds that Sao Tome and Principe is fulfilling only 83.8% of its expected commitments to the right to education based on the country's level of income. HRMI breaks down the right to education by looking at the rights to both primary education and secondary education.

Is EMAE dragging down the economy of São Tomé & Príncipe?

The troubles afflicting utility EMAE are dragging down the economy of the island nation. The United Nations Development Program is seeking consultants to conduct feasibility studies for a 2 MW solar project and three mini hydropower plants ranging in size from 1.15-2 MW in São Tomé and Príncipe.

"In 2021, São Tomé and Príncipe exported USD17 million in Cocoa Beans, making it the 28th largest exporter of cocoa beans in the world," according to Observatory of Economic Complexity (OEC). Food processing industries have also been taking root in São Tomé and Príncipe, especially in the form of fish processing.
