How many people live in Turks & Caicos?

There are roughly 30,000 inhabitants on the islands and they welcome about 450,000 arrivals by air and 650,000 cruise ship passengers each year. The archipelago consists of two island groups, the Turks islands and the Caicos islands, of which Grand Turk and Providenciales are the two main islands.

Where are the Turks and Caicos Islands located?

The Turks and Caicos Islands (abbreviated TCI; /tːrks / and /keɪkəs,-kəs /) are a British Overseas Territory consisting of the larger Caicos Islands and smaller Turks Islands, two groups of tropical islands in the Lucayan Archipelago of the Atlantic Ocean and northern West Indies.

Are Turks & Caicos a self governing territory?

The Turks and Caicos Islands participate in the Caribbean Development Bank, is an associate in CARICOM, a member of the Universal Postal Union and maintains an Interpol sub-bureau. The United Nations Special Committee on Decolonization includes the territory on the United Nations list of non-self-governing territories.

What is the difference between caya hico and Turks Island?

The indigenous Turk's head cactus named Turks island, while the Lucayan term "caya hico", meaning string of islands, was mangled to become "Caicos". For about 700 years, the Taíno and Lucayan tribes were the sole residents on the islands (particularly settling on Grand Turk and the Middle Caicos).

The Turks and Caicos Islands are only about 60 km (37 miles) long, and consist of over 40 islands and cays. These islands have fabulous beaches throughout; in particular, Grace Bay. There also are a variety of fun, non-beach things that ...

No. A person is or becomes a Turks and Caicos Islander through the provisions of the Turks and Caicos Islander Status Ordinance 2015 (or Immigration Ordinance prior to that date) whereas a person becomes eligible for a Turks and Caicos Islands passport as a result of being a British Overseas Territory Citizen (of the Turks and Caicos Islands) under the provisions of the British ...
